



D6.4 – Final Stakeholder Conference Report

[WP6 – Dissemination Communication Exploitation]



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Abstract

The LEAD-PRO Final Summit, held on 18th June 2026, marked the culmination of the project’s activities and provided an opportunity for consortium partners, stakeholders, policymakers, researchers, practitioners, and end-users to reflect on the project’s achievements, lessons learned, and future impact.

The conference showcased the key outcomes of the project, highlighted innovative methodologies and tools developed throughout the project lifecycle, and facilitated discussions on the future of security research, stakeholder engagement, and societal resilience. The event also served as a platform for networking, knowledge exchange, and the identification of opportunities for future collaboration.

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Executive summary

The LEAD-PRO Final Summit was held on 18 June 2026 at the Valencia Local Police Headquarters under the title *International Summit on Emergency Management: Disaster Response and Urban Resilience*. The event brought together policymakers, emergency management practitioners, first responders, researchers, technology providers, civil society representatives, and international experts to discuss the future of emergency management, disaster preparedness, crisis coordination, urban resilience, and societal security.

The summit served as the final dissemination event of the LEAD-PRO project and provided a platform for presenting project results, demonstrating technological innovations, sharing lessons learned from recent emergencies, and discussing future priorities for European resilience and security.

The programme combined high-level keynote speeches, operational case studies, expert panel discussions, networking activities, and an overview of the LEAD-PRO integrated platform. This report summarises the event outcomes as a summary report for the **D6.4 – Final Stakeholder Conference**.



1. Introduction

The LEAD-PRO project aims to equip Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) and first responders with advanced AI-based tools and technologies that enhance their capabilities across all operational phases and contribute to digital societal resilience. The core of the project is an operational cutting-edge software platform designed to reduce response times, improve decision-making effectiveness, and increase productivity in the use of human and material resources during disaster-related events. The platform will integrate essential functionalities such as task planning, geolocation, communication, video streaming, Command and Control (C2), drone management, visual computing, and data analysis to provide real-time situational awareness. The project's ultimate vision is to deliver a platform that is 100% operative at TRL 8-9, adhering to stringent European Security Standards. The unique value proposition of LEAD-PRO is to create an easy to use and flexible platform for the planning, command, control and monitoring of multi-stakeholder forces. A platform which could be scaled massively and would not require significant training for basic use. The platform will reduce response time, while improving productivity of resources and effectiveness of FR decisions.

The Final Summit represented the culmination of the project's activities and provided an opportunity to disseminate results, gather stakeholder feedback, and discuss future developments in European emergency management.

- Present the main achievements and outcomes of the LEAD-PRO project.
- Promote dialogue among policymakers, researchers, emergency responders, and technology providers.
- Share lessons learned from recent emergency situations.
- Explore the role of emerging technologies and artificial intelligence in crisis management.
- Discuss governance, coordination, and resilience-building strategies.
- Strengthen European cooperation in disaster response and urban resilience.
- Promote sustainability and exploitation of project results beyond the project's lifetime.

Panel 1: Policy, Governance and Crisis Coordination

Key Themes

- Crisis governance
- Multi-level coordination
- Public administration preparedness
- International cooperation

Main Conclusions

- Effective governance structures are essential for successful crisis response.
- Coordination mechanisms must be established before emergencies occur.
- Resilience requires cooperation between public authorities, operational services, and communities.

Panel 2: Technology, Artificial Intelligence and Situational Awareness

Key Themes

- Artificial intelligence for emergency management
- Cybersecurity and resilience
- Data integration and situational awareness
- Decision-support technologies

Main Conclusions

- AI and advanced analytics can significantly improve operational decision-making.
- Interoperability remains a critical challenge.
- Technology must complement human expertise rather than replace it.

Panel 3: First Responders and Operational Coordination

Key Themes

- Emergency response operations
- Multi-agency coordination
- Civil protection
- Community preparedness

Main Conclusions

- Strong interagency cooperation remains fundamental to effective emergency response.
- Continuous training and joint exercises improve preparedness.
- Local knowledge is critical during crisis situations.

Panel 4: Future Resilience and Inclusive Security



Moderated by Professor Vladlena Benson, this panel explored resilience beyond emergency response and examined how inclusive approaches contribute to stronger and more adaptable societies.

Key Themes

Resilience as a Long-Term Societal Capability

The discussion highlighted that resilience should be viewed as an ongoing societal capability rather than solely an emergency response function. Trust, community engagement, institutional legitimacy, and social cohesion were identified as essential elements of long-term resilience.

Human-Centred Security and Digital Trust

Panellists examined how cybersecurity awareness, organisational learning, digital trust, and responsible AI governance contribute to resilience. Human behaviour and organisational culture were identified as critical factors influencing the effectiveness of technological solutions.

Digital Transformation and Organisational Adaptation

The panel stressed the importance of knowledge management, adaptive organisations, digital skills, and innovation adoption as key drivers of resilience.

Inclusive and Gender-Responsive Crisis Management

A substantial discussion focused on how emergencies affect different population groups differently and how crisis management systems can better address these differences.

Topics included:

- Gender-responsive emergency planning
- Inclusion of vulnerable populations
- Accessible communication systems
- Inclusive decision-making
- Diversity in security and technology professions

Main Conclusions

- Inclusive approaches improve both fairness and operational effectiveness.
- Digital trust and cybersecurity resilience will be central to future emergency management.
- Resilience depends on people, institutions, technology, and social cohesion working together.
- Diversity and inclusion should be considered strategic resilience factors rather than solely social objectives.

3.5. LEAD-PRO Project Presentation and Demonstration

- Dissemination through project newsletters and partner communication channels.

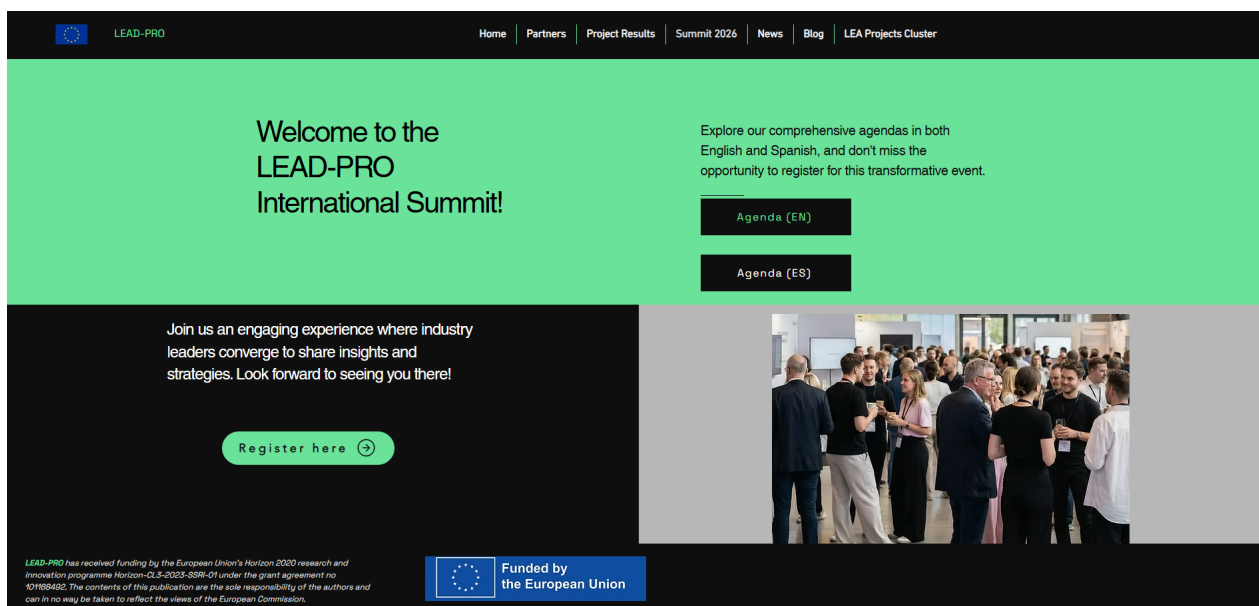


Figure 1 Registration – LEAD-PRO WEBSITE

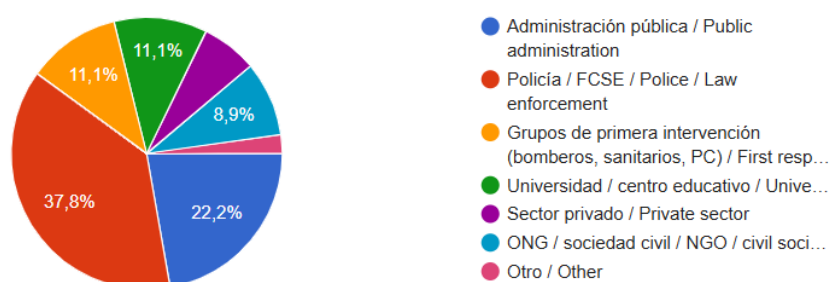


Figure 6 Type of organisation.

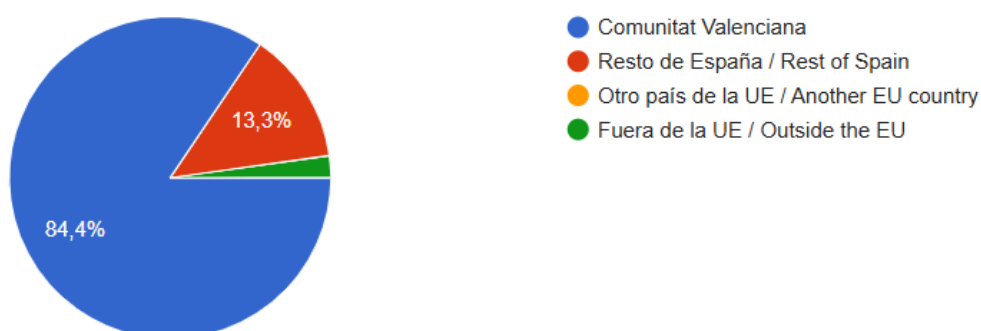


Figure 7 Country of origin.

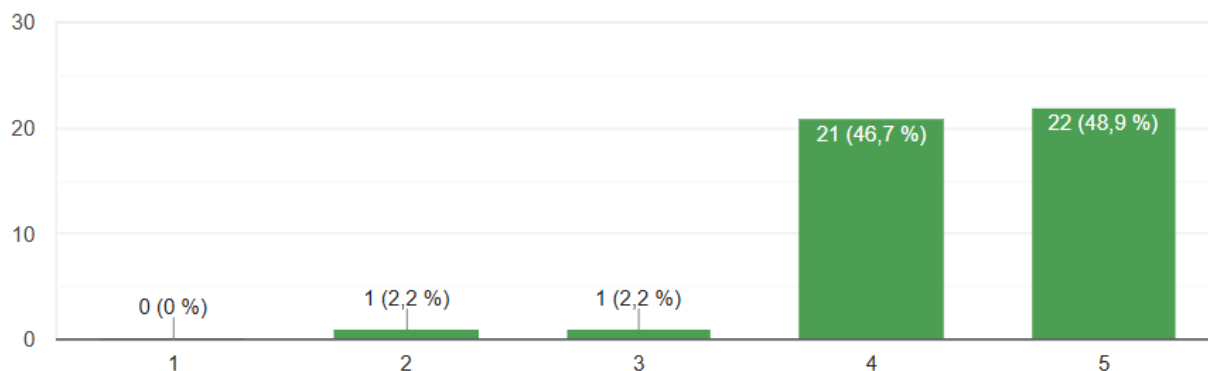


Figure 8 Overall evaluation scores.

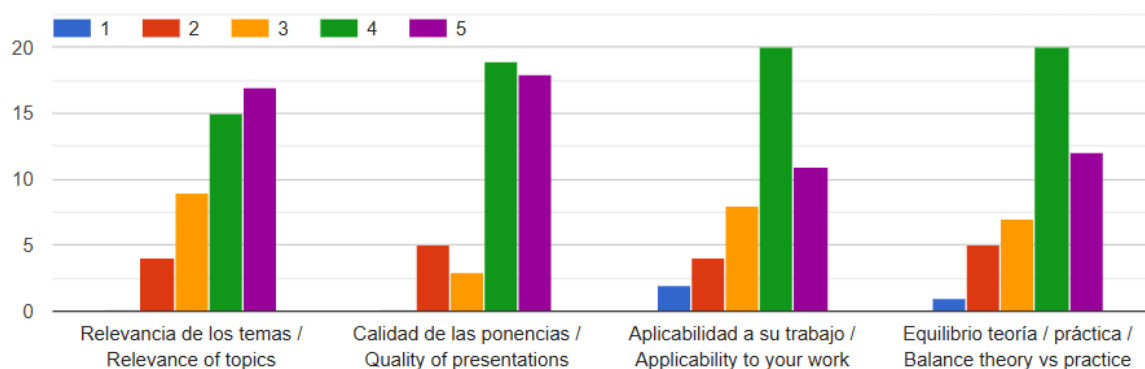


Figure 9 Evaluation of the conference content.

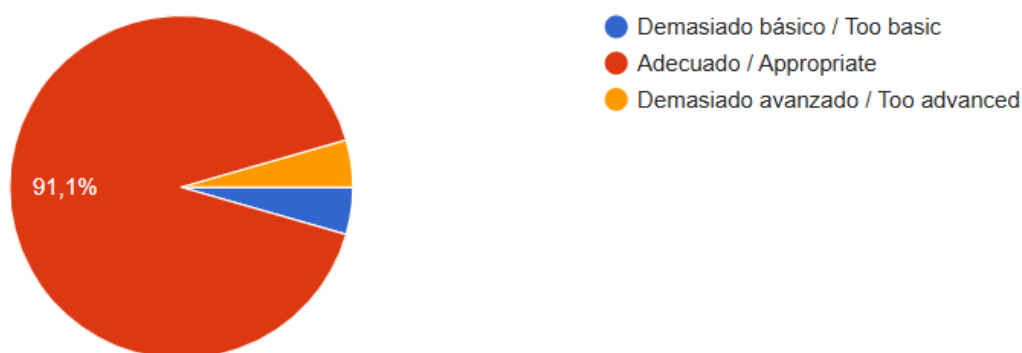


Figure 10 Technical level of the presentations.

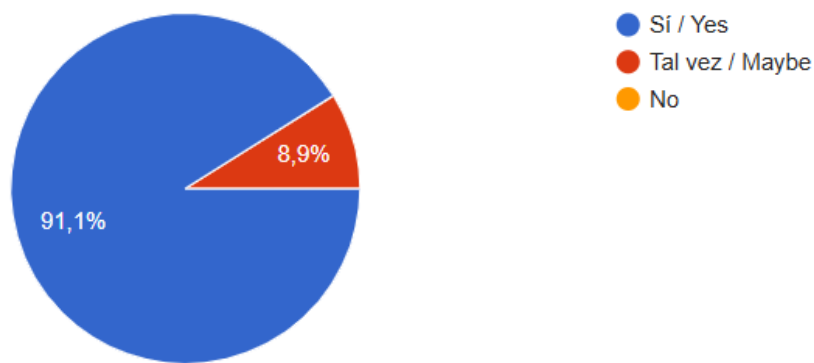


Figure 11 Willingness to participate in future LEAD-PRO activities.

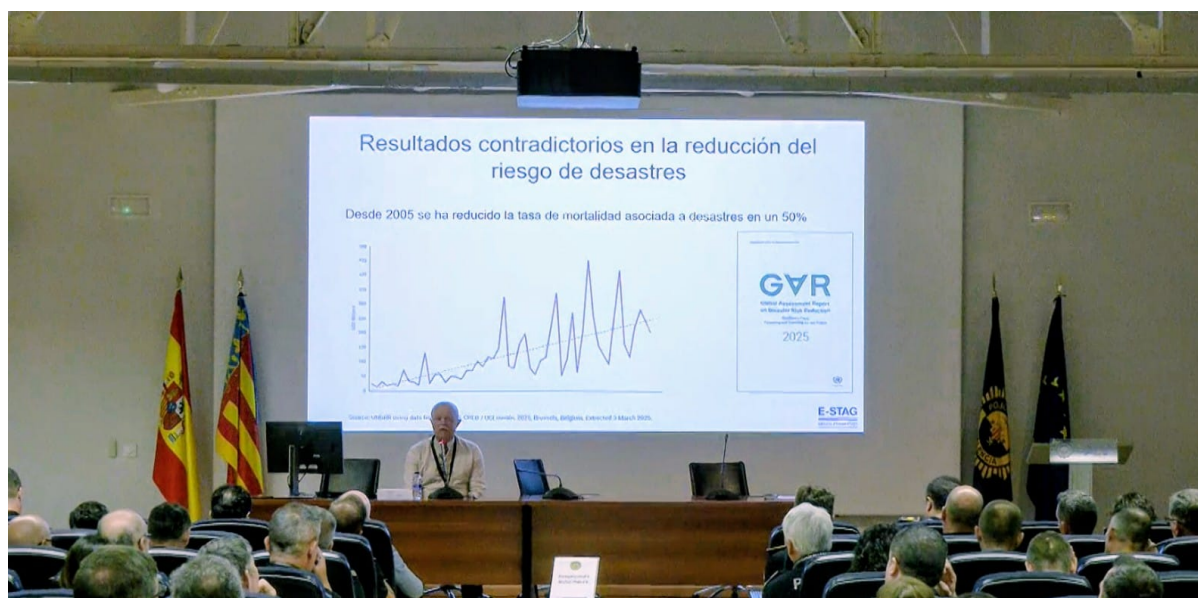


Figure 14 Keynote 2- Urbano Fra Paleo, UNDRR

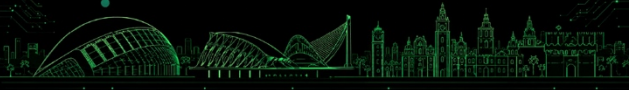

Annex II – Participant Statistics

The international summit held in València on 18 June 2026 gathered 158 registered participants.

The distribution by stakeholder category was as follows:

Annex III – Participant Feedback Results (46 answers)

A bilingual (Spanish/English) evaluation survey was distributed to all participants of the international summit held on 18 June 2026. A total of 46 responses were collected, representing approximately 29% of registered participants. Respondents reflected the stakeholder diversity of the event: law enforcement (37%), public administration (21.7%), first responders (10.9%), universities and education (10.9%), NGOs and civil society (8.7%), private sector (8.7%) and other (2.2%). Most respondents came from the Valencian Community (84.8%), with additional responses from the rest of Spain (13%) and from outside the EU (2.2%).

Overall satisfaction. The summit received an average overall rating of 4.41 out of 5, with 96% of respondents rating it 4 or 5. When asked whether they would recommend the event to a colleague on a 0–10 scale, the average score was 8.7, with 63% of respondents giving a score of 9 or 10.

Organisation and logistics. All organisational aspects were rated above 4 out of 5: support from the organising staff (4.52), technical means including audio, projection and interpretation (4.46), registration and pre-event communication (4.37), venue and facilities (4.33), punctuality and adherence to the programme (4.24) and catering (4.02). Only 5 respondents (10.9%) reported a logistical issue, all of them minor (availability of power

sockets for laptops, a gluten-free catering option and isolated technical support matters), which have been noted for future events.

Content assessment. Content-related aspects were also positively rated: quality of presentations (4.13), relevance of topics (4.00), applicability to the respondent's work (3.78) and balance between theory and practice (3.83). The technical level of the sessions was considered appropriate by 91.3% of respondents, with only 4.3% finding it too basic and 4.3% too advanced, confirming that the programme was well calibrated for a mixed professional audience.

Most valued sessions. In the open question on the most useful session (26 responses), the content most frequently highlighted was the presentation on the management of the October 2024 DANA flood emergency in València, followed by the panels on first responders and operational coordination, the keynote speeches, and the sessions on disinformation, artificial intelligence and inclusive security. Several respondents indicated that all sessions provided value.

Topics for future editions. When asked which topics they would like to explore further (44 responses, multiple selection), respondents prioritised inter-service coordination (61.4%), crisis communication (61.4%) and disinformation in emergencies (54.5%), followed by civil protection and volunteering (34.1%), technology and drones (25%) and European cooperation (18.2%).

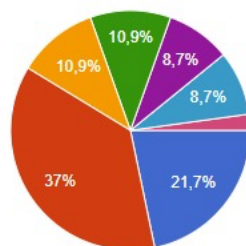
Future engagement. 91.3% of respondents stated that they would take part in future LEAD-PRO or similar activities, with the remaining 8.7% answering "maybe" and no negative answers, indicating a strong basis for continued stakeholder engagement.

Qualitative feedback. Open comments (13 responses) were largely positive, praising the quality, preparation and balance of the two-day event. Constructive suggestions included: a more practice-oriented approach with real case examples and hands-on elements, clearer prior coordination of the working language (Spanish/English) at each panel, greater visibility of citizen volunteering and people-centred approaches, more time for networking and audience participation, and earlier and wider dissemination of the event. These suggestions have been taken into account in the recommendations section of this deliverable.

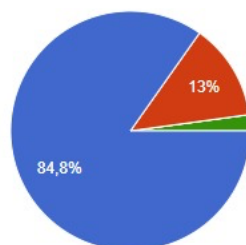

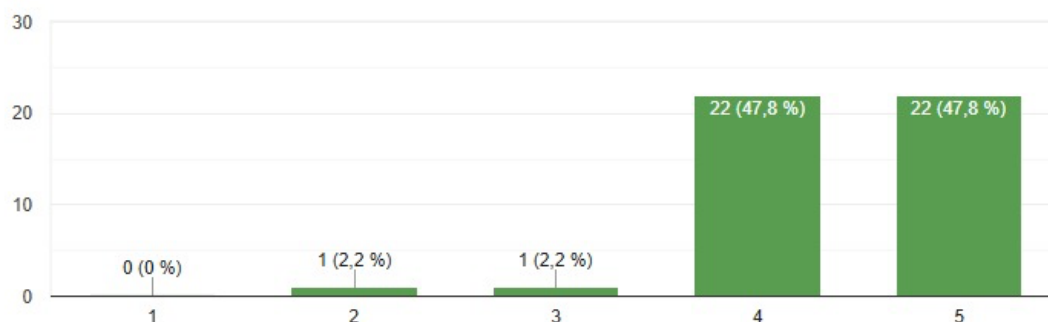

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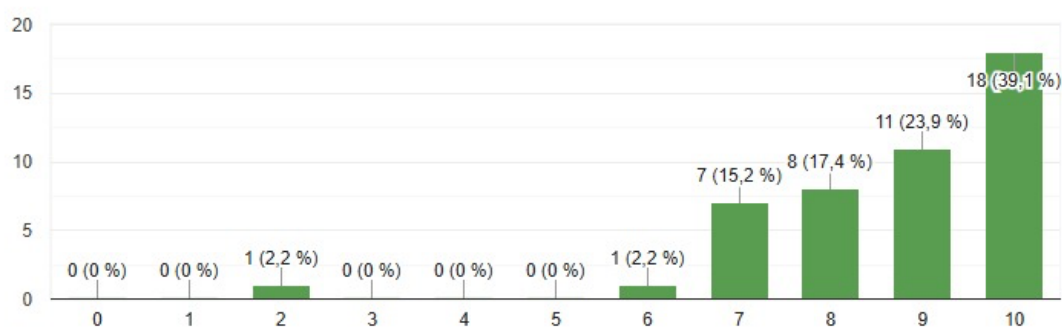

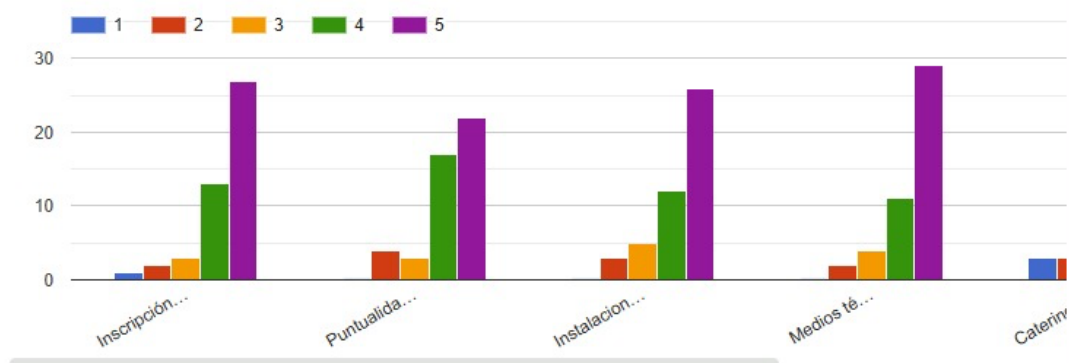

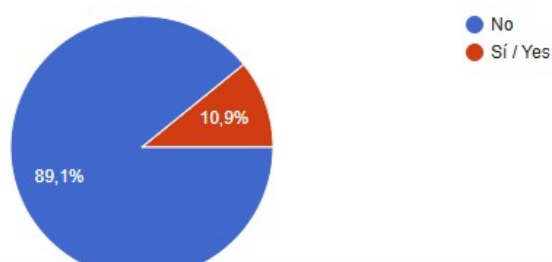
